WINTER MAINTENANCE – WINDROWS

Snow left at the bottom of driveways after a snowplow has gone by is called a windrow. The priority of snow removal is to clear the travelled portion of the road. The only place to move the snow is onto the boulevard, which includes driveways. If you have cleared your driveway, but Snowplows have not cleared your street, be prepared for a windrow at the bottom of your driveway.

When clearing snow from your driveway, pile the snow on the right side of the driveway (looking towards the street from driveway). This will reduce the amount of snow pushed back into your driveway when the street is plowed.

Also, reduce the amount of snow pushed back by not parking on roadways during the winter months. Plows need to move around parked vehicles, which create snow build-up. Ultimately when the vehicles are moved and further plowing is done, snow build-up is pushed back into driveways.

Winter Dos and Don'ts for Residents

DO NOT

- Park on any roadway as it prevents timely and efficient snow removal.
- Put waste containers on the road, sidewalks, and snowbanks.
- Shovel, plow, or blow snow onto roads or sidewalks, it is not only a safety hazard; it is against the law.

DO

- Give snowplows plenty of room as they are working to keep roads safe.
- Keep fire hydrants and catch basins clear.
- Take extra time and caution when travelling as roads and sidewalks can be slippery.

TOWN OF SHELBURNE 2023 NOTICE OF RATE CHANGE WATER AND SEWER

Please take notice that an increase in the Water and Sewer Base Rate Charges and Consumption Charges will take effect the first invoice of 2023 to be received in March 2023 for the consumption period (January 1-March 1, 2023).

Rate increases for both Water and Sewer are outlined in By-Law 2020-10 Water and Sewer Rates passed by Council in February 2020. The By-Law provides for rates for the years 2020-2025 and are reflective of data collected in the updated Water Rate Study with respect to future water and sewer operating and capital needs.

To protect your meter and pipes, ensure that they are kept warm; they should be insulated or located in areas that are kept warm. Keep garage doors closed to ensure pipes located there are kept warm; even a cracked garage door can allow entry of enough cold air to freeze pipes and meters.
