## FREEZE THAW CYCLE AND THE IMPACTS ON ROADS AND SIDEWALKS Roads DAMAGED GRASS FROM WINTER MAINTENANCE Grass near the sidewalk can

Grass near the sidewalk can become damaged during winter maintenance efforts. Sidewalk plowing presents many challenges; particularly throughout the winter when it is dark and difficult to tell exactly where the edge of the sidewalk is due to snow coverage. When the ground is frozen, damage is minimal. When ground is not frozen, during thaw cycles and milder temperatures, it lifts away very easily or can become damaged.

Operators actively address both issues to keep conditions safe. Staff regularly sand and salt for traction on sidewalks and work to address potholes throughout Town this time of year.


