BYLAW NUMBER 8-1983

A BYLAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC IN THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF SHELBURNE.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF SHELBURNE BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL THEREOF ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1 DEFINITIONS

1. BOULEVARD means that portion of a highway, other than a sidewalk or an entrance from a roadway to a private road, driveway, or lane, between the curb lines or the lateral lines of a roadway and the adjacent property line;
2. BYLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER means a person appointed by the Corporation to enforce this Bylaw;
3. CORPORATION means The Corporation of the Town of Shelburne
4. CROSSWALK means:
That part of a highway at an intersection that is included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the edges of the roadway, or
Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or other markings on the surface;
5. GROSS WEIGHT means the combined weight of vehicle and load;

Bylaw #8-1983, is amended by Section 1.6 is repealed and replaced by the following:

6. HEAVY TRAFFIC means the use of a highway for travel or parking by a vehicle, object, or contrivance for moving loads, having a gross weight, including the vehicle, object or contrivance and load, in excess of five (5) tonnes; (Bylaw 57-2006)
7. HIGHWAY includes a common and public highway, street, lane, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct, or trestle, designed for and intended for, or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles;
8. HOLIDAY means a holiday as defined in the Interpretation Act;
9. INTERSECTION means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other;

SECTION 4 PARKING BY PERMIT

- 4.1 Parking Permits for the parking of motor vehicles are hereby authorized and assigned, as the Council of the Town of Shelburne may hereafter designate by Bylaw, at municipal lots set out respectively in Schedule "R" of this Bylaw.
- 4.2 Where a sign has been erected and is on display indicating parking is prohibited without a permit, no person shall park a motor vehicle at any time in specified municipal parking lots set out in Schedule "R" unless such person is the holder of a parking permit issued under this Bylaw or has received permission from the Town of Shelburne.
- 4.3 An application for an off-street parking permit shall contain the following information: a. name and address of applicant; b. the license plate number, make and year of the motor vehicle of which the applicant is the registered owner;
- 4.4 An off-street parking permit shall contain the permit number, current year issued and the name of the municipal lot for which the permit is issued. (Bylaw 5-2021)

SECTION 5 PARKING AND STOPPING REGULATIONS - UNSIGNED AREAS

- 5.1 No person shall on any highway park or stop any vehicle:
 - a) in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of traffic or the clearing of snow from the highway;
 - b) in such a manner as to interfere with highway cleaning operation;
 - c) in front of, or within 2 m of a driveway or laneway or so as to obstruct vehicles in the use of driveway or laneway;
 - d) within 3 m of a point on the curb or edge of the roadway adjacent to any fire hydrant;
 - e) within 10 m of an intersecting roadway;
 - f) for the purpose of washing, greasing, or repairing a vehicle;
 - g) for the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale;
 - h) in such a position as to prevent the removal of any other vehicle previously parked;
 - i) within 15 m of any intersection controlled by traffic signals;
 - j) on the traveled portion of the roadway other than a cul-de-sac where the roadway width is 6 m or less.

5.2 No person shall park or leave any motor vehicle on any Municipal property where by means of one or more signs, it is indicated that such parking or leaving is not authorized.

SECTION 6 PARKING AND STOPPING REGULATIONS – SIGNED AREAS

6.1 Where signs in accordance with the Regulation of the Highway Traffic Act are displayed, no person shall park any vehicle:

- a) on any highway in front of an entrance to or exit from any building or enclosed space in which people may be expected to congregate in large numbers;
- b) on any highway within 8 m of any fire hall on the side of the highway on which the fire hall is located, or within 30 m of such fire hall on the opposite side of the highway;
- c) within 15 m of an intersection controlled by traffic lights;
- d) within 15 m of an intersection;
- e) within the turning basin of a cul-de-sac;
- f) within 15 m of the end of the roadway on a dead-end highway;
- g) other than a school purpose vehicle in a school bus loading zone;
- h) any time between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. Monday to Friday inclusive, on one or both sides of a highway or portion thereof which is immediately adjacent to a school.

SECTION 7 PARKING RESTRICTIONS – SCHOOL BUS

Bylaw 8-1983 is amended by inserting the following:

7.1 Where signs in accordance with the Regulation of the Highway Traffic Act are displayed, no person shall park any school bus vehicles on any municipally owned parking lot, or roadway without a permit for parking (Bylaw 25-2012)

SECTION 8 PARKING RESTRICTIONS – UNHITCHED TRAILERS

Bylaw 8-1983 is amended by inserting the following:

8.1 No person shall park any trailer on any municipally owned roadway or parking lot unless the trailer is attached to a vehicle which is mechanically capable of towing the trailer. (Bylaw 32-2016)
