Clean Yards Bylaw



WHAT IS A CLEAN YARDS BY-LAW?

The Clean Yards By-law sets out minimum standards for properties in the Town of Shelburne including some rules on litter, waste and property maintenance to help ensure that properties are safe, clean and attractive in relation to adjacent properties.

Clean Yards By-law has rules regarding:

- Vegetation, grass, weeds, and trees,
- Garbage, waste, litter and debris
- Standing water,
- Storage of: composting, firewood
- Vacant lots
- Derelict motor vehicles, boats and trailers
- Graffiti

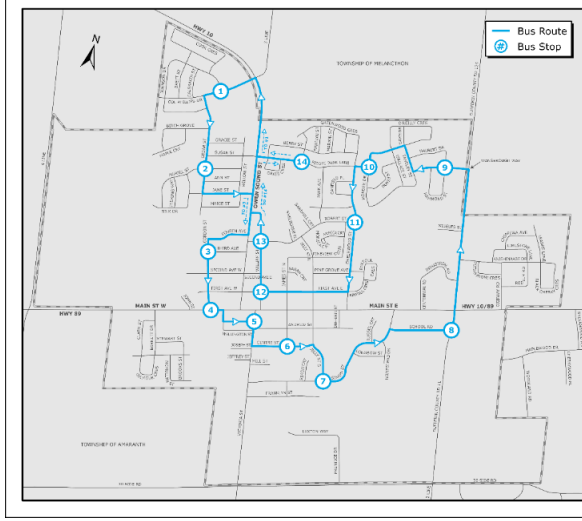
RIDE THE GTR FOR FREE THIS SUMMER!

Passengers can ride the Grey Transit Route (GTR) at no cost on weekends throughout the summer on all routes. Riders traveling on Saturdays or Sundays between May 20 and September 3, 2023 will not be required to pay to ride the GTR.

That's fare free weekends in Shelburne all summer long! The weekend service allows riders to wait at any of the 14 weekend stops. There is no pre-booking for the weekend service.

WATERING TIPS

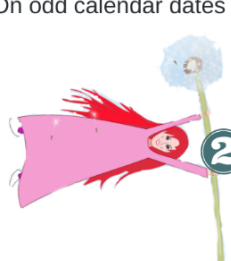


1 Follow the watering schedule:
June, July and August

On even calendar dates = **EVEN** addresses ending with numbers **0, 2, 4, 6, 8**

On odd calendar dates = **ODD** addresses ending with numbers **1, 3, 5, 7, 9**

2 Do not water when it is windy. Wind can blow sprinklers off target and speed up evaporation



3 Water in the morning. Mornings are cooler and winds tend to be calmer so water can soak into the soil and be absorbed by grass roots before it can evaporate.



4 Invest in a rain barrel to collect rain water. Water collected in your rain barrel is actually better for your garden because it doesn't contain any chlorine contaminants and is at ambient temperature



5 Experts say you only need 2.5 cm (1 inch) of water, a week, including rainfall, to maintain a vibrant healthy lawn. Considering adding mulch to the garden bed to reduce watering requirements. Plant water efficient plants, trees and vegetables.



6 Fix Leaky Faucets and Toilets. A leaky toilet can waste up to 20 cubic meters a day which could cost you \$28 extra per day!



7 Use a cover on your pool when it is not being used. It will cut down on evaporation and keep it cleaner and warmer



8 When washing your vehicle, use a bucket with sponge plus a trigger nozzle and you will save litres of water.
