

### FROZEN PIPES

Frozen pipes can be a serious inconvenience and may even stop water from flowing into your home. If you suspect a frozen pipe, the first step is to locate the frozen section.

#### PREVENTING FROZEN PIPES

- Keep indoor temperature above 8°C near pipes.
- Seal leaks and keep garage doors closed.
- Insulate exposed pipes and drain outdoor faucets

#### THAWING A FROZEN PIPE

If a pipe freezes inside your home:

- Turn on the nearest tap
- Warm the pipe starting near the tap.
- Use safe methods like warm towels or a space heater (to heat the room, not the pipe directly)

Primary roads such as Greenwood St, Fiddle Park Lane, Simon St and Victoria St will be cleared first, followed by residential streets, crescents and courts.
